


Stormwater Pollution Comes in Many Forms



Often times in stormwater pollution discussions, the topic is sediment reduction, bacteria levels, or other chemical compounds found in the water. In one Pennsylvania watershed the topic is nurdles. Nurdles are tiny plastic pellets (smaller than 5 mm or 0.20 in) that are used in the plastics industry for the manufacture of plastic products. A Western Pennsylvania plastics company is faced with paying \$2.6 million in penalties and remediation costs for repeated pollution violations in Raccoon Creek and the Ohio River. Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Secretary Jessica Shirley said, "Pennsylvanians have a right to a clean and safe environment." The nurdles were first discovered by a water monitoring group on the Ohio River and Raccoon Creek. This is a clear example of if you see something, say something.
